

RESEARCH OBJECTIVES

- Find out what New Zealanders think about the use of potentially offensive language on television or radio – such as swear words, blasphemies and other potentially derogatory or offensive language
- Focus on derogatory language that may be offensive due to cultural / ethnic context, or from a gender / sexual orientation perspective
- Understand whether / how public views are changing in relation to the use of particular language in broadcasting
- Identify any areas of increasing concern in the community about offensive language in broadcasting to inform BSA decision-making

METHODOLOGY



METHOD

- Research conducted by Nielsen on behalf of the Broadcasting Standards Authority (BSA)
- Online panel survey – 1,500 randomly selected individuals aged 18+
- Online ‘open’ survey link distributed to community representatives, Citizens Advice Bureaus and Community Law Centres – to increase Māori and Pasifika engagement

FIELDWORK

- Survey conducted 4 April – 1 May 2018
- **31 words tested** – including new words added in 2018
- Consulted and sought input from Te Taura Whiri i Te Reo Māori, Human Rights Commission, Ministry for Women
- Offensiveness tested in **11 scenarios** – different broadcasting contexts

RESPONDENTS

- Total respondents: **1,514**
- Maximum margin of error of $\pm 2.5\%$ at a 95% confidence interval

WEIGHTING

- Results were weighted to be representative of the New Zealand population by region, age group, gender and ethnicity

KEY FINDINGS

2018 MOST UNACCEPTABLE WORDS IN BROADCASTING

- Cunt, Nigger, Jesus Fucking Christ, Cocksucker, and Mother fucker – remain the top five most unacceptable words across all scenarios
- However, notable decline in the proportion who find four of the five totally unacceptable
- Racial / cultural insults added to the list in 2018 appeared in the top 12 – Chink, Gook, Coconut
- Homo, also new, appeared at 11th most unacceptable
- Small but notable increases in proportion who find some gender-related words totally unacceptable, e.g. Bitch, Dick, Prick
- Level of unacceptability for some blasphemies has decreased significantly – Jesus Christ, God and Jesus Fucking Christ



THE IMPORTANCE OF CONTEXT – ACCEPTABILITY ACROSS SCENARIOS

CONTEXT AFFECTS THE LEVEL OF ACCEPTABILITY

- The chart shows the proportion of New Zealanders who feel the 31 words tested are:
 - Totally **unacceptable** in all scenarios
 - Depends** on the scenario
 - Totally **acceptable** in all scenarios
- The proportion who considered the words *'totally unacceptable in all scenarios'* is similar to 2013
- The proportion who said whether the use of potentially offensive language is acceptable *'depends on the scenario'* has increased
- Those who find the use of potentially offensive language *'totally acceptable in all scenarios'* has decreased

CONTEXT AFFECTS THE LEVEL OF ACCEPTABILITY



WHO

- Offensive language when used by a member of a group or community when referring to themselves or others within the same group or community, might be more acceptable.
- Offensive language when delivered by someone outside of the community, may be less acceptable.
- Offensive language appears to be less acceptable when used by the broadcaster than when used by the public/subject of the broadcast (e.g. programme host vs caller to the programme).



WHAT

- The public seems to be more accepting of offensive language used in stand-up comedy or TV drama shown after 8.30pm.
- While the time of broadcast may be a relevant factor, audience expectations are also important.
- Where audiences reasonably expect the use of potentially offensive language, they have an opportunity to decide whether or not to listen to/watch the programme.



WHERE

- The public appears to find offensive language on radio less acceptable than on TV.
- However, this is likely to be influenced by the type of content, with radio content mostly involving real people (e.g. hosts, callers or interviewees, commentators on live sports games) compared with more fictional content on television.



WHEN

- Time of day plays a significant role in the acceptability of strong language.
- Offensive language used in a TV drama or comedy between 7pm-8.30pm is significantly less acceptable compared with similar content delivered after 8.30pm.



WHY

- There appears to be growing awareness (and less tolerance) in society of possible harm or upset caused by some words or expressions which allude to a person's gender or sexual orientation, or to cultural or ethnic diversity.
- The use of potentially offensive language in reference to a specific person or group appears to be less acceptable across the board than in the past, irrespective of the context.



HOW

- Whether potentially offensive language has been scripted (e.g. in a TV drama) or is used spontaneously (e.g. reality TV) impacts the level of acceptability.
- While in the past offensive language used spontaneously was more likely to be considered acceptable, this is now less the case.

THE IMPORTANCE OF CONTEXT

"It depends on the host. I am more comfortable hearing 'faggot' from a gay host than a straight one."

"Dyke, fag, faggot, bulldyke, all used to abuse members of the LGBT community by people who do not necessarily realise their implications, but might be used acceptably by the LGBT community towards each other."

"The use of words on TV brings them into general use e.g. the Toyota ad where the dog says 'Bugger' - now used generally."

"Discuss and debate the offence and see why the other person has taken offence to something you may have said."

"Don't know, but I have friends that are Māori and call themselves Hori, so that's a hard one. All comes down to why it's being used in what context."



"I think some words that used to be used as a derogatory phrase towards people of non-straight sexual orientation or non confirmative genders should not be used now out of respect for people's lifestyle choices. I wouldn't think them out of place on a historical drama for instance though, because that would have been the language and culture of the time."

"Other derogatory terms for homosexuals such as queer or bender, etc. I would generally consider such terms to be unacceptable except when used in stand-up comedy or possibly parody."

"It always depends on context and time during the day or evening. I generally don't like words used in a derogatory manner towards someone or some group. Some words are offensive unless used in humour, and once again in the right context and the right audience."

"I don't find saying things like 'fuck' offensive until you are using that language to make another person uncomfortable/ talk down to them / insult them, etc."


OFFENSIVENESS FROM A CULTURAL / GENDER / SEXUAL ORIENTATION PERSPECTIVE (1)

NEW ZEALAND'S DIVERSE CULTURES, COMMUNITIES AND LANGUAGES

CULTURAL PERSPECTIVE – WE ASKED:

New Zealand is rich with a diverse range of cultures, communities and languages. As a result, it is not only words traditionally thought of as swear words in English that may offend. Words or expressions in English or in other languages may be offensive depending on the cultural perspective of the audience.

Are there any words or expressions (either in English or in other languages), not on the earlier list, that you would personally find unacceptable from a **cultural perspective** if used in a broadcast, or that may be offensive depending on the cultural context?


OFFENSIVENESS FROM A CULTURAL / GENDER / SEXUAL ORIENTATION PERSPECTIVE (2)

NEW ZEALAND'S DIVERSE CULTURES, COMMUNITIES AND LANGUAGES

GENDER / SEXUAL ORIENTATION PERSPECTIVE – WE ASKED:

Our community is becoming increasingly aware of the harm or upset that may be caused by some words or expressions people use, which allude to a person's gender or sexual orientation.

Are there any words or expressions, not on the earlier list, that you would personally find unacceptable from a **gender or sexual orientation perspective** if used in a broadcast, or that may be unacceptable depending on the context?

WHY IS THIS LANGUAGE CONSIDERED OFFENSIVE?

CULTURAL PERSPECTIVE

"Raghead - used offensively to describe people wearing turbans for cultural and / or religious reasons"

"Kefe, keo - these words are very offensive in the Samoan language and should never be used in TV or radio."

"A lot of words in Samoan unacceptable to Samoan listeners and viewers. Samoan swear words for example. But these words because of different meaning may not be offensive to say, Tongan or other Pacific viewers and listeners. Quite a lot of words and expressions. Need lots of time to write down and explain."

"Any word that is degrading to a person's nationality e.g. coconut, chink, nigger, slit eye, etc."

"Pakeha is a derogatory term offensive to those of European descent."

"Anything that describes other races in a derogatory way - calling an Indian a 'curry muncher', any descriptors that negatively describe sexual orientation – e.g. calling someone 'gay' as an insult, not referring to their sexuality."



GENDER OR SEXUAL ORIENTATION PERSPECTIVE

"Words such as 'poofter' or 'faggot' are harmful because they are usually said with malice or hate (even when it's the caller's insecurity). It's different in a humorous context, providing you know the recipient liked the humour too. Otherwise, live and let live."

"If a male gets called a girl for struggling to do something I guess I could get offended as females are nothing less than males."

"I think 'Tranny' is offensive to the transgender community, and Dyke is an offensive term for lesbians. In both instances the offence from the words themselves is increased by the tone which is usually derogatory and often aggressive."


"Again can't think of any other offensive words that offend me but there are double meaning phrases that do in many radio ads e.g. a person asks a roofing company rep if she is 'always on top'."

"Faggot, fag, dyke, lesbo - if not used by someone from the LGBTQ community are unacceptable."

OTHER OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE

- Respondents were also asked to identify any other words, not previously listed, they would personally find unacceptable if used in a broadcast
- One in five (20%) referenced cultural based / racist words or phrases
- Also slight increase in the identification of words or phrases from a sexist / sexual orientation perspective

DEMOGRAPHIC VARIATIONS

YOUNGER GENERATIONS ARE TYPICALLY MORE ACCEPTING

- **Benchmark scenario:** Word used in a TV movie screened after 8.30pm, where a criminal being arrested is swearing at police
- **Green** = more acceptable than the average
- **Red** = less acceptable than the average
- Typically, younger people find the use of offensive language in broadcasting more acceptable
- Except for words relating to gender or sexual orientation – eg, higher proportion of 18-24 year olds find 'Homo' unacceptable

THOSE OF PASIFIKA AND ASIAN ETHNICITY ARE LESS ACCEPTING

- Those of Pasifika and Asian ethnicity are least accepting of the use of potentially offensive language in broadcasting
- Those who identified as NZ European / European are typically more accepting
- Māori are also generally more accepting

FEMALES ARE LESS ACCEPTING THAN MALES

- Significant differences between males and females in levels of acceptability of offensive language, particularly:
 - Homo: 39% of males find it fairly or totally unacceptable cf. 61% females
 - Retard: 38% males cf. 59% females
 - Chink: 46% males cf. 65% females
 - Cunt: 58% males cf. 76% females

OTHER DEMOGRAPHICS

- Those who are Christian are least accepting, with higher or significantly higher levels of unacceptability for most words
- Those of no religion are more accepting
- As combined household income increases, so does the level of acceptability
 - \$100,000+ household income – more accepting across the 31 words tested
 - <\$30,000 household income – less accepting across the 31 words tested

NOTES TO THIS REPORT

When a result is discussed in relation to the proportion who found a particular word unacceptable, this refers to the word being rated as either '*Fairly unacceptable*' or '*Totally unacceptable*'.

Statistically significant differences are highlighted or commented on in this report. Where no highlighting has been used (or no commentary about a sub-group included), it may safely be assumed that differences are not statistically significant or they are not pertinent.

Statistically significant differences in this report are significant at the 95% confidence level. That is, we are 95% confident results are not just normal expected variances that result from talking to a different sample within the same population (note: the smaller the sample size, the higher the expected variance between samples and less likely that there will be statistically significant differences).

ROUNDING OF FIGURES

All percentages are rounded from two decimal places and, therefore, some 'Total' results may not add to 100%.

COMPARISONS WITH PREVIOUS YEARS

Changes to the makeup of the survey, including words listed and scenarios, impact direct comparability with previous measures in 2013, 2009, 2005 and 1999. Respondents were presented with 31 words as per previous measures. However, eleven words were removed and replaced to be reflective of New Zealand society in 2018.

Words removed included 'Crap', 'Fuck off', 'Jesus', 'Balls', 'Piss', 'Piss off', 'Whore', 'Bollocks', 'Bloody', 'Bugger', 'Bullshit'. Replacement words were 'Hoe', 'Pussy', 'Gook', 'Coconut', 'Pōkokohua', 'Kai a te kurī', 'Puaaelo', 'E te fai la'u mea e ai', 'Chink', 'Homo', and 'Hori'. One scenario, '*When used during a sports commentary programme on TV or radio*', was also included in 2018.
